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












A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

Good Evening!

When I first wrote this piece, I have to confess that I did so self-ishly in an attempt to bring a story and genre that I love back to the spotlight in our modern theatre. Having directed and researched avidly through Euripides and his works, I am always so pleased to hear gasps of recognition for any audience when Medea and Jason lay their cards on the table.

However, when the story finally materialized into the mouths of Afro-Latinx characters, I realized that this story is much bigger than what I have originally intended. I must credit Dr. Sonia Arellano for pointing me toward the analysis of "borders" in Latinidad, given by Lorgia García-Peña. Medéa is "una rayana," a border-crosser. Not only has she moved through the physical borders of land and water, but she also crosses the borders of gender, of race, of politics, and of language. I challenge you to examine when Medéa speaks as herself and where she enacts this defiant crossover with those she speaks to.

I am beyond pleased at the equitable and responsible treatment this work has been given by the Ren, its multicultural (and multilingual) cast and production team, and for you, in your support of bringing diversity to the FRONT of the Central Florida stage.


